Get tickets now for 2010 Gratitude Roundup

There are only about four weeks left to get your tickets for the 2010 Calgary Gratitude Roundup being held June 11 to 13 at the Coast Plaza Hotel in northeast Calgary.

About 1,100 Calgary and area AA members, as well as visitors from out of town, are expected to attend the 29th annual Roundup, which again this year features an excellent line up of speakers, and AA meetings over the three days.

This is the second year the Roundup is being held in the 11,000 square foot Coast Plaza Hotel conference centre. The hotel, located at the intersection of 16th Ave (TransCanada Highway) and 36th Street NE, is on major bus routes and is also within close walking distance of Franklin LRT (C-Train) station.

The price of Roundup tickets remains unchanged from 2009. Roundup registration tickets are \$20, which provides access to all speakers and meetings and two dances, and \$58, which covers registration plus the buffet banquet on Saturday evening. There is limited banquet seating so anyone planning to attend is urged to buy tickets in advance. Registration and banquet tickets are available from many Intergroup and Calgary General Service Committee members as well as AA Central Office in Calgary.

Among the speakers addressing the Roundup this year are Kip C. from San Diego California, Dorothy H.

of Calgary, Rick B. of Minneapolis, Minnesota, Garry P. of Saskatoon, Sask. and Heather M. of Winnipeg, Manitoba. Also on the program is Al-Anon speaker Barb L. of Saskatoon, Sask. and an Alateen speaker.

The conference registration desk opens Friday at 5:30 p.m. and again on Saturday at 7 a.m.

Along with the keynote speakers, the Roundup will also offer three regular AA meetings including Night Owl AA call-up meetings both Friday and Saturday at 11 p.m. and the Upon Awakening meeting Saturday at 7 a.m.

The always popular Big Book seminar will be offered over four sessions, with a study of Steps 1 to 3 at 6:30 p.m. Friday, Steps 4 to 7 at 8 a.m. Saturday, Steps 8 and 9 at 4:30 p.m. Saturday, and Steps 10 to 12, Sunday at 8:30 a.m.

The Friday night dance with a DJ begins at 9:45, while the Saturday night dance with a DJ follows the banquet, starting at about 10.

The buffet banquet gets underway Saturday at 6:30 p.m., with Mathew M. as master of ceremonies. Feature events during the banquet include a White Hat Ceremony welcoming the AA speakers to Calgary, and the Sobriety Countdown. Banquet speaker, Garry P. of Saskatoon will take to the microphone at about 8 p.m.

There are a number of opportunities to serve on various committees such as Intergroup and Calgary General Services Committee (CGSC), as well as subcommittees such as Corrections, Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC), Bridging the Gap, Public Information, Telephone Monitoring, Special Events and Archives to name a few.

Service opportunities range from helping the committees that organize AA programs and services, to working more directly in carrying the message to alcoholics who still suffer.

Most service opportunities begin at the home group level – get involved with your home group and make contact with your respective Intergroup and CGSC representative to discuss service. As well a number of service opportunities with contact information is also described in the Calgary and District AA monthly newsletter – The Westword.

If the monitor has a call, particularly from someone who is new to the AA program, or perhaps coming back, who wants to talk to someone in more detail about AA, the monitor turns to the 12th Step List. The monitor contacts someone on the 12th Step List to see if they can help the individual caller.

You can pick your times when you are available, and you don't have to sit home waiting for a call. What is the 12 Step List?

This list contains the AA members who are willing to have their names and phone numbers listed for 12 Step calls.

Listings are by area of the city and home group.

The list is used by phone monitors when a caller needs to talk with another alcoholic.

You may talk with them a short time or for a long time. Or, with another AA friend*, you may meet them for a coffee, take them to a meeting, or visit them in their home.

You list your available times and what parts of the city you are willing to travel to. A car is helpful but not necessary.

How to sign up

Return this application form to Central Service Office or to your Intergroup Representative. Once you are on the list, any changes you want to make just call Central Service Office and ask for Mathew.

*** Never go on a 12 Step Call on your own.**

What are Midnight Monitors?

These are people willing to take calls between 11:00 at night and 8:30 in the morning.

Their phone numbers are given to the answering service who forwards calls, on rotation, directly to them during that time.

It usually involves only talking & listening, and occasionally getting someone on the 12 Step list to call them back the next day.
