Powerful messages shared at Gratitude Roundup

A homeless, hopeless drunk who somehow survived a life filled with tragedy, who found AA and went on to become a successful lawyer and businessman, and a woman who described a rebellious downward spiral as a youth that brought her to a life on the streets, hospitals and detention centres before coming to AA, were just two of the compelling stories heard by hundreds of Calgary and AA members attending the recent 2010 Calgary Gratitude Roundup.

Kip C. who now lives in San Diego, California and Heather M. of Winnipeg, MB described their remarkable journeys of recovery to nearly 1,000 delegates attending the 29th annual Gratitude Roundup held in June.

Kip C., in his address during the opening night of the Roundup, stunned many in the audience, with the tragic details of several events during ever-worsening years of drinking. His drinking progressively worsened after a serious accident permanently disabled his seven-year-old son, a marriage failed, other family members died tragically, he was eventually unable to take care of his daughter, and he even botched his own suicide attempt. He ended up, near death and destitute, living in a filthy bamboo shack before getting to AA and finding a higher power, which turned his life of hopelessness into hope.

Heather M. was a model, top-of-the-class 13-year-old, raised in a good home, before she suddenly rebelled, leading her to a life on the streets in Vancouver. With a family that never gave up on her, she eventually ended up

living with her grandmother in Manitoba where her drinking and circumstances only got worse. She was in and out of mental hospitals and faced the prospect of years in detention before an uncle convinced authorities to let him take the young woman to AA. With the help of a higher power and the AA program she was able to rebuild her life.

Garry P. of Saskatoon, who spoke at the Saturday evening banquet, attended by about 320 AA members and guests, described how his drinking worsened during his NHL career as he played for teams such as Chicago, New York and Philadelphia. It was a bad knee, which eventually ended his sports career, but the drinking continued as he later tried to raise a family and run a business in Saskatoon. With his wife joining the AA program some months before he did, Garry P. was faced with the prospect of losing everything that was important to him if he didn't stop drinking. Finally getting to AA, he today relies on the strength and guidance of his higher power and has dedicated himself to helping others and giving back to the AA program.

Dorothy H. of Calgary, described how alcohol initially, as a young girl, allowed her to fit in socially, but progressively worsened over the years resulting in failed relationships, lost jobs and an over whelming feeling of no self worth. It was only after getting into the AA program and experiencing a spiritual awakening and finding a high power, that she learned to view herself with dignity and discover true value as a human being.

What is the 12 Step List?

This list contains the AA members who are willing to have their names and phone numbers listed for 12 Step calls.

Listings are by area of the city and home group.

The list is used by phone monitors when a caller needs to talk with another alcoholic.

You may talk with them a short time or for a long time. Or, with another AA friend*, you may meet them for a coffee, take them to a meeting, or visit them in their home.

You list your available times and what parts of the city you are willing to travel to. A car is helpful but not necessary.

How to sign up

Return this application form to Central Service Office or to your Intergroup Representative. Once you are on the list, any changes you want to make just call Central Service Office and ask for Mathew.

** Never go on a 12 Step Call on your own.*

What are Midnight Monitors?

These are people willing to take calls between 11:00 at night and 8:30 in the morning.

Their phone numbers are given to the answering service who forwards calls, on rotation, directly to them during that time.

It usually involves only talking & listening, and occasionally getting someone on the 12 Step list to call them back the next day.
